

The following information from the Registry of the International Court of Justice is communicated to the Press:

At the hearings which will begin on Saturday, October 12th, 1957, during which the Court will deal with the request for indication of interim measures of protection in the Interhandel Case (Switzerland v. United States of America), the Presidency for the Case will be exercised by the Vice-President of the Court, M. Badawi, since the President of the Court, Mr. Hackworth, is a national of one of the Parties to the Case.

Since the Swiss Government does not have a Judge of its nationality on the Bench, it has designated as its Judge ad hoc M. Paul Carry, Professor in the Law Faculty of the University of Geneva. M. Carry will be installed at the beginning of the hearing.

The Parties have informed the Registry that they will be represented before the Court as follows:
