Communiqué No. 65/18

The following information from the Registry of the International Court of Justice is communicated to the Press:

In the course of 24 public sittings in the South West Africa cases (Ethiopia v. South Africa; Liberia v. South Africa) from Monday, 20 September to Thursday, 21 October 1965, the Court heard nine witnesses and experts called by South Africa.

These were:

Mr. K. Dahlmann, Editor of the Allgemeine Zeitung, Windhoek; The Rev. J.S. Gericke, Vice-Chairman of the Synod of the Dutch Reformed Church of South Africa; Professor D.C. Krogh, Head of the Department of Economics, University of South Africa; Professor C.A.W. Manning, formerly Professor of International Relations, University of London; Brigadier-General S.L.A. Marshall, Chief Historian of the United States Army in a number of theatres; Mr. L.A. Pepler, Director of Bantu Development in South Africa; Professor S.T. Possony, Director of International Political Studies Program, Hoover Institution, Stanford University, California; Dr. C.H. Rautenbach, Rector of the University of Pretoria; and Dr. H.J. van Zyl, Deputy Secretary, Department of Bantu Education.

Witnesses and experts, after examination by counsel for South Africa and cross-examination by the Agent for the Applicants, were questioned by members of the Court.

The next hearing will be on Tuesday, 26 October at 3 p.m., when counsel for South Africa will begin the continuation of their address.
